

The Territory Government is targeting problem drinkers to turn them 'off tap' and mandate treatment to stop the violence.

60 per cent of all assaults are alcohol related.

From 1 July the Banned Drinker Register will help enforce Problem Drinker Bans Territory-wide.

■ New Problem Drinker Bans — people taken into protective custody three times in three months, or who commit alcohol-related crime and violence

■ New Mandatory Treatment and Rehabilitation Orders — with more treatment options across the NT

■ New Banned Drinker Register to record Banned Problem Drinkers

Banned Drinker Register — scanning photo ID for take-away alcohol.

■ Your photo ID will be scanned against the Register – it's a quick scan

- No information about you or your purchase will be recorded
- If you're not banned, you buy your alcohol as normal
- These changes will not affect the price of alcohol
- It's a small inconvenience to help cut crime

If you're a Banned Drinker you will be banned everywhere across the Territory

If you're a Banned Drinker it will be illegal for you to buy, possess or consume alcohol

If you knowingly supply alcohol to a **Banned Drinker you can be banned too**

Supply Restrictions in Alice Springs

Product and trading hour restrictions exist in Alice Springs under the local Alcohol Management Plan, e.g. a limit of one cask wine purchase per day.

To enforce the restrictions, an Alcohol **Restrictions Monitoring System records** purchase details of restricted products until midnight on the day of purchase.

This system is different to the Banned Drinker Register, which does not record information.
